An Example of the DA's Office Addressing Inequality and Inequity in Our Communities


THE PROBLEM

- 1/2 of all young adults with criminal records have reading problems¹
- 7 out of 10 inmates in state prison perform at the lowest literacy levels²
- California Department of Corrections has used 4th grade reading levels as a factor in determining the number of jail cells required in the future.³

The DA's Office recognizes that the issue of illiteracy is one of the major inequities in our community and has a significant impact upon those who are involved in the criminal justice system.
